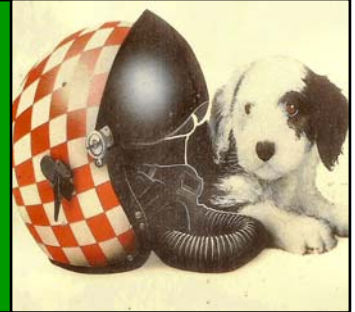

too low for these lanky youths. Adie and Jason created quite a laugh when they walked into the Pilots Pals Bar. Fortunately it was

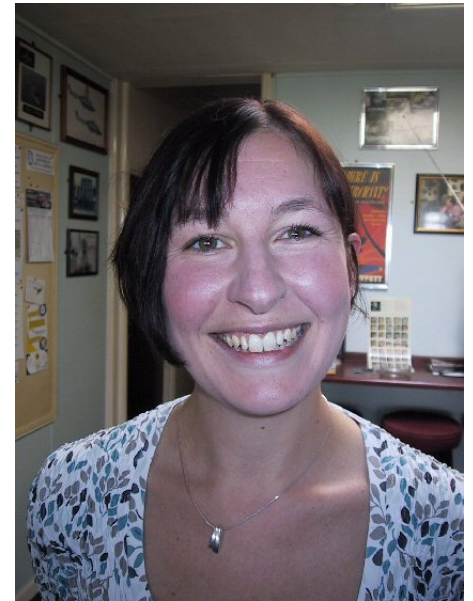

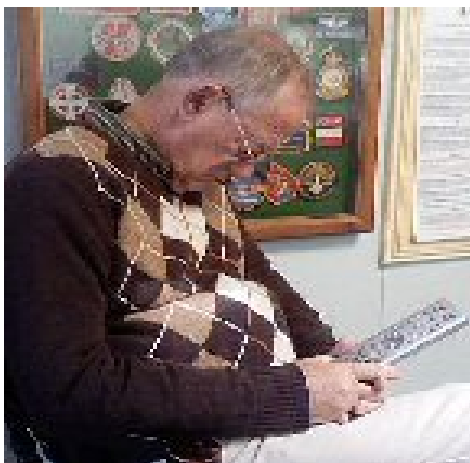
SPANISH G.P. LUNCH DATE
