MARCH WEATHER

March's weather has been a bit erratic, with quite extensive periods of poor visibility, rain and low cloud, plus fairly strong winds that were quite across our single runway. But from an operational point of view, because of the wind direction, Biggin Hill has made quite extensive use of Runway 03 this month.

But we are now entering April, and the clocks went to British Summer Time (one hour ahead of UTC now of course) and we are moving into Spring and on towards Summer, and hopefully much better weather, plus significantly longer daylight hours will enhance the available time for GA flying training.

AIRPORT DEVELOPMENT PROGRESS

A normal quick review of the various Airport developments/improvements.....

The "Landings Hotel" is now completed and has now formally opened to the public. A perfect facility for visiting aircrew who are here for a few days before their next departure. It also provides an excellent facility for the many staff who work at the airport for some of the large new maintenance organisations, and who are often significantly distant from their own homes and their families.

It looks very smart and with the special Battle of Britain statue and gardens looking stunning, it will certainly all looks very impressive from the road.

Taxiway "Bravo" joining the "Foxtrot" taxiway to the current "Alpha" and "Charlie" taxiways is progressing well, and it is targeted to be completed and into operational service towards the end of May or thereabouts. It is designed to improve access for the airport's much larger corporate jets to taxi safely to and from Runway 21 for Jetex and Bombardier, without having to use the current, much narrower, "Alpha" taxiway.

The Airport's new "Hub" training facility was formally opened in mid-February and this coincided with a very successful careers day that attracted well over 120 potential future aviation employees. (This facility remains a short-term solution to address the more strategic need for an Aviation Training College here.)

Biggin Hill Airport certainly looks more and more impressive than things were in the past, ensuring that our wonderful ex-Battle of Britain airfield is likely to always remain operational into the long term. Our airport management should be congratulated in ensuring the Airport's long-term future, and which has prevented the plans that some anti-airport people had to try to close it down and turn it into a massive and unwanted housing estate.

The airport has indicated that they still intend to be supportive of General Aviation aircraft operations at Biggin, but clearly the commercial nature of the airport that will clearly ensure it's long term future, will almost certainly mean that it will never be the cheapest place to operate from.

From an operational point of view, it is imperative that all light aircraft operations do continue to make sure we all follow the various noise abatement routings and avoid the NSA's (Noise Sensitive Area's),

which is of course something the airport management has accepted that our based aircraft do always strive to do.

BIGGIN HILL AIRPORT FEES (FROM APRIL 1ST 2023)

But for the benefit of light aircraft owners and operators, the landing fees for aircraft up to maximum all up weight not exceeding 1,700 Kgs from April 1st 2023 has been increased to £55 plus VAT.

APRIL BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, excluding VAT, for the calendar month of April 2023 are:

£1:86.5 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using <u>fuel account card</u> Only from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 5p per litre)

£0:87.3 per litre for Jet A1 (or £1:55.5 per litre for "Sustainable Aviation Fuel"!)

<u>SPECIAL NOTES:</u> Users are advised that <u>credit and debit cards **can no longer** be used at the self-refuel pumps.</u> If you use self-refuelling, you will need your airport H-TEC fuel account card with you when you go there. (if you haven't got one with you, you will have to go over to the Main Terminal apron to uplift fuel from the bowsers instead).

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

March has been yet another solid month for the Airport in terms of traffic movements, although these were slightly down on March 2022. This still consists of a very good end to the financial year. The continuing economic uncertainty remains a concern for the aviation industry, especially those scheduled Airports that are still well below pre COVID movement levels. That said, concern regarding the challenging labour market has stabilised and the Airport is extremely well placed for what we hope will be another very busy summer period.

This month saw the formal opening of the Landing Hotel and feedback so far has been outstandingly positive. Remarkably, the Hotel experienced its first 100% occupancy only 3 weeks after opening and we have been delighted that many local residents have made lunch and dinner reservations. The Airport continues to enhance the entrance to Churchill Way with the completion of the landscaping around the hotel and the Strongest Link statue.

As regards the regeneration of West Camp, the Airport continues to engage with Mr Ecclestone, the London Borough of Bromley and Heritage England. Demand for hangar developments remains high and the Airport are currently in talks with a number of potential new tenants to add to our ever-increasing eco system.

Works to compete the new Bravo taxiway proceed at pace and the taxiway is targeted for completion towards the end of May. Finally, the Airport will soon embark on the redevelopment of a section of our existing FBO to provide improved crew facilities.

The Airport's new Hub training facility, which was opened on 16th Feb, has already proved to be very popular with several local companies booking training space throughout March. This remains a short-term solution to address the more strategic need for an Aviation Training College. Discussions continue with training providers to seek their interest in a long-term solution.

The Airport continues to engage with NATS, ACOG and the CAA, regarding a new ACP for an IFR approach to 03. The ACP for the 21 RNAV overlay has now successfully passed Stage 2 and external consultations will be held very shortly.

Finally, I would once again like to thank the Airport community for its continued support in adhering to the Airport's Noise Abatement procedures and in helping the Airport to continue to act as a good neighbour. I am particularly impressed with the adherence to the Biggin Hill/Tatsfield NSA where we have seen a significant reduction in infringements when compared to the first quarter last year. Thank you
