JANUARY WEATHER

The weather in January has, as is normal in the winter, been virtually unflyable for most of the month for Light Aircraft flight training. We have had a lot of poor visibility and low cloud days, plus of course several significantly strong storms with very heavy rain, causing flooding and waterlogging in grass airports. In addition many days have had very strong and gusty winds that made it pretty unflyable for the airport's students and even PPL's.

But, apart from some continuing strong winds on some days, the final week or so of January became quite clear and mainly flyable again.

Lets keep our fingers crossed for some more flying days in February....

SO NOT MUCH GOOD STUFF TO TALK ABOUT THIS MONTH

"DOUBLE TROUBLE" – BOEING 707 SERIOUS PROBLEM AND RECOVERY

As most of you will recall, in the recent December Newsletter we reported the sad passing of our old Biggin Hill'ite friend, Martin Emery.

Just recently I watched several National Geographic TV Air Crash Investigation programmes. One that I watched was entitled "Double Trouble", which was about the Trans-Air Service Boeing 707 flight in March 1992 from Luxembourg to Kano in Nigeria. The first officer was our old friend Martin! The aircraft, whilst flying over the Alps, lost two engines on the right-hand side.... But not just lost the power from them – the two engines actually tore off the wing and physically parted company from the aircraft!!!

The crew were amazing and managed to get the aircraft under control and make an emergency landing at a French military airport, not far from Marseilles.

For those of you that may not have seen this TV programme, I have located an online location where the programme that was transmitted by National Geographic can be viewed.

I'm sure those of you involved in aviation, and particularly those who knew our friend, Martin, who sadly passed away late last year, will find the TV programme well worth watching! They did a magnificent job and (as can be seen right at the end of the programme) were given an award for their handling and operation as the flight crew.

(There are also a number of seriously complementary comments on their handling of the situation, by another friend of many of us – Bob Grimstead, who was a British Airways pilot until his retirement, but still a well-known light aircraft owner and display pilot.

As many of you Old Biggin Hill'ites know of course, James (Jim) Gibbs funeral took place in St Bartholomew's Church in Horley, near Gatwick on the 22nd January. WEATHER WARNING CENTRIK REPORTS

For many of you who still regularly fly at Biggin Hill, I am sure those of you who are registered on the Airport's Centrik system will have started receiving the new "Weather Warning" emails!

These emails don't provide the recipient with the actual information that may be relevant, but simply ask the recipient to follow the link into the Airport's Centrik system, where they can then see what it is that they are warning us about – things like strong and potentially gusty winds, frosts or fog, etc.

But, in my personal opinion (and many others who have expressed similar views), it is genuinely unnecessary for us to be forced to log in to Centrik simply to see what they are actually warning us about!

Since the start of these warnings being generated on 17th January, and up to the point of actually writing this section in the Newsletter, there have been a total of 32 such warning messages in just 10 days!

Whilst I, and many others, are of course perfectly happy to receive these warnings, it is really totally unnecessary for us to have to physically log in to Centrik each time to see what the warning is about. The airport should appreciate that, virtually all pilots view all the relevant METAR's and TAF's that are available every 30 minutes to us through the Met Office Aviation Briefing Service online.

I am personally perfectly happy to receive these warnings of course, but I am not at all happy to be required to log into Centrik just so I can see what it is they are saying!

Why does the airport not simply send the actual warnings out as a brief email to your mailing list showing the what the warning is, rather than suggesting we waste time logging into Centrik for each one, just to see what the warning is about. Most pilots would be happy, I'm sure, to simply receive a brief email that describes the warning being given – not telling us to log into Centrik just to see what it is...!

I am not complaining really, but I have already taken the time to contact the airport and "recommended" that they review the method used to send out these warnings – please do, otherwise what is actually a good practice by those concerned to warn us of things, it is really unnecessary to force us to log in to Centrik each time to see what the warning actually is.....

FEBRUARY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, *excluding VAT*, for the calendar month of February 2024 are:

£1:78.9 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using <u>fuel account</u> <u>card Only</u> from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 5p per litre)

£0:90.7 per litre for Jet A1 (Sustainable Aviation Fuel £1.14.2 per litre)

SPECIAL NOTES: Users are advised that <u>credit and debit cards</u> **can no longer** be used at the <u>self-refuel pumps</u>. If you use self-refuelling, you will need your airport H-TEC fuel account card with you when you go there. (if you haven't got one with you, you will have to go over to the Main Terminal apron to uplift fuel from the bowsers instead).

FALCON / EFG

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

The Airport has enjoyed a positive start 2024 after a lean last quarter of 2023. The Airport saw an increase in aircraft movements in December last year and that has continued during Jamaury. Global business jet activity so far this year is currently 5% behind last year, 18% ahead of comparable January 2019. Through January, European bizjet activity is trending 3% behind last year, 5% ahead of comparable January 2019. Sectors in Germany are down 11% compared to last year, 13% behind January 2019. Similarly, France is behind both January last year and 2019, UK remains ahead of 2019 despite 3% declines versus last year.

The Airport ended last year with just over 22% of the London market, behind Luton at just under 27% and Farnborough at just under 30%. The top 3 airports increased their collective market share to 78.84%. Whilst the Airport continues to attract inward investment, the current economic challenges require prudent stewardship and careful control of costs. That said, the Airport continues to explore development opportunities and attract additional operators to the Airport.

The Airport intends to launch its Economic Footprint study by the end of January and, as previously reported, the headline figures are extremely positive. Direct and indirect employment has risen to 2,284 jobs and generating a GVA (gross value added) of £181.1 million, up from £70 million when last surveyed in 2012. The Airport hopes to publish the report before the end of this calendar year as this further demonstrates the commitments the Airport made back in 2015.

The Airport continues to progress its submission for a full operational trial for the 03 RNAV approach. The trial plan will be submitted no later than the end of March. Trax Int. (the Airport's Airspace Change Consultant) have been working hard to keep the CAA engaged in the process to ensure a high possibility of the trial being approved. It is critical that the focus is on an innovative design solution using Radius to Fix, which is not currently in use in the UK.

The 21 RNAV ACP Consultation closed last year and the Airport is now preparing the post consultation documentation for submission by 26th January 2024. Part of the submission documentation will be an RNAV to ILS, LNAV/VNAV and an LVP approach. The aim is to implement the procedure by early 2025.

Having completed the initial Air Quality assessment with Envirosuite, supplier of the Noise & Track keeping system Webtrak/ANOMS, the Airport is now entering the 2nd phase of its Air Quality Monitoring initiative with the installation of additional sensors. The monitors will have an increased number of sensors to detect SO₂ (Sulphur Dioxide), NO₂ (Nitrogen Dioxide), Co (Carbon Monoxide), VOC (Volatile Organic Compounds) and 0₃ (Ground Ozone). The sensors will also detect Particulate matter 1, 2.5 and 10 micrograms of solid or liquid particles in the atmosphere.
