JAMES (JIM) GIBBS

Sadly on 11th December we apparently lost another long-term Biggin Hill'ite, Jim Gibbs.

His wife, Carol, notified me over Christmas (having been able to trace Jim's contacts when in the UK). She confirmed that Jim's passing was very sudden during a short stay in hospital in Cyprus suffering from a respiratory failure followed by cardiac arrest. A recent Postmortem established that he had suffered from a heart condition, which they were already aware of. Jim was 87.

For the old Biggin Hill'ites who will almost certainly have known Jim back in the 60's and 70's he will be remembered as a keen aviator. He flew initially at Vendair Flying Club with Harry Harris and Charlie Vaughan, whilst I was flying myself at Experimental Flying Group with Rex Nicholls and Peter Elliott. We often met up, particularly in Dillow's Café near to Surrey and Kent Flying Club and Bill Webb's hangar. I remember him virtually always flying with his dog, once he had his licence.

Originally Jim lived in Chislehurst in his family's home near to the station, and subsequently had a home near to Gatwick, before moving to Cyprus, where he and Carol married and have lived for many years, albeit coming back to the UK every so often, particularly when there were air shows at Biggin to partake in the social scene.

There was also a memorial service that was held in Cyprus on December 20th at St. Andrews Church, Kyrenia, which can be viewed by his old friends using the following link:

JANUARY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, <u>excluding VAT</u>, for the calendar month of January 2024 are:

£1:75.9 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using <u>fuel account card Only</u> from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 5p per litre)

£0:88.2 per litre for Jet A1 and Sustainable Aviation Fuel (while in stock...)

<u>SPECIAL NOTES:</u> Users are advised that <u>credit and debit cards can no longer</u> be used at the <u>self-refuel pumps.</u> If you use self-refuelling, you will need your airport H-TEC fuel account card with you when you go there. (if you haven't got one with you, you will have to go over to the Main Terminal apron to uplift fuel from the bowsers instead).
