## **THE DAMBUSTERS 70 YEAR ANNIVERSARY CONCERT**

Biggin Hill Airport featured very strongly in the Dambusters Anniversary celebrations when, on May 17<sup>th</sup>, RizonJet's huge hanger was transformed into a concert venue for BBC Radio 2's 'Friday Night is Music Night' evening broadcast.

Over two and a half thousand paying guests watched the evening concert featuring The BBC Concert Orchestra, The Central Band of the RAF, The RAF Squadronnaires, and the Military Wives Choir, that was broadcast live on the national radio channel. The concert told the Dambuster's story through music, narration, archive and drama, read by presenters Dermot O'Leary and Jeremy Vine.

On the morning of the concert, BBC Radio 2 also broadcast the Chris Evans morning show live from a Lincolnshire RAF station. The broadcast then terminated with Chris Evans getting airborne in the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight's iconic Lancaster, which then flew him to Biggin Hill, where the Jeremy Vine show was being broadcast live and featured the aircraft's arrival.

The Main Road in Biggin Hill, where the approach path crosses it, came to a complete standstill as the Lancaster flew in, as people listening to the live broadcasts flocked to the airport to witness the arrival. After landing, the aircraft backtracked and taxied alongside the road, with DJ Chris Evans waving to the crowd from the top hatch of the Lancaster.

Thanks to the BBC for again putting our airport back on the map for the public, as well as for the excellent and appropriate tribute for the anniversary of the Dambusters Raid..

Advance tickets cost £18 per day for adults and £8 per day for under 16's. There is no charge for babies and children under 3 years old. To buy your tickets, you will require a username and password for the website. These are:

## **NICK DAVIDSON MEMORIAL FLYING SCHOLARSHIP**

The 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2013 saw the presentation of this special scholarship to 20 year old John Harrison from Horsham at a special ceremony in the airport terminal.

Air Cadet John was picked out of dozens of young hopeful's following a demanding process of interviews and assessments run by Easyjet Training Captain and Biggin Hill'ite, Gary Merchant, who was handling the process on behalf of Nick's widow, Alina Davidson.

John is very active in the Air Cadets, having reached the rank of Cadet Flight Sergeant with 1015 Squadron, and received an award for best NCO in 2012. He holds both Silver and Gold awards for gliding at the RAF's Central Gliding School at RAF Syerston, and is to become a civilian gliding instructor at RAF Kenley. John is passionately keen to pursue a career in aviation, so this award could not go to a more appropriate recipient.

At the ceremony, Mrs Davidson presented John with a flight bag containing the syllabus, study books and equipment that will assist in his training programme with Surrey & Kent Flying Club at Biggin Hill Airport.

Mrs Davidson also confirmed that the Scholarship (worth some £9,000 to the winner) will be repeated again in 2014 and has again asked Gary to find another worthy winner next year.

We congratulate John on winning this scholarship, and wish him every success in his future aviation career.
