BIGGIN HILL LOSES MORE OLD FRIENDS

Sadly I have to report the passing of two more old Biggin Hill'ites:

BOB GIBBS

Bob first flew at Biggin Hill in the late 60's, and was, for a while, the Operations Manager at Fairflight Charters, one of Biggin's largest and most successful charter companies. Bob moved over onto the flight department, becoming a pilot with the company and handed over the Ops job to yours truly. He flew Doves, Heron's, and Chieftains all over Europe, and then transferred to Air Ecosse, Fairflight's Scottish division, where he flew Bandeirantes, and Twin Otters predominantly for the Scottish Oil support industry.

In more recent years, Bob has been a Captain on a corporate Global Express operating from the Middle East, along with two or three other old Biggin Hill'ites.

Bob died, I believe, after a short period of illness. His funeral was held on 31st May in Swanwick, Derbyshire. Bob's name has been added to the Biggin Hill Reunited "Roll of Honour". R.I.P. Bob...

MARQUEE FOR THE FESTIVAL OF FLIGHT

The Hurricane Marquee and Enclosure is now very close to maximum capacity, so if you originally reserved them and haven't taken up your tickets, they are now being sold to other takers on a first come, first served. The same as for the actual show entry tickets, the Enclosure tickets will also not be available to anyone once the capacity has been reached, and in any case there will be no facility to process purchases after Wednesday 8th June. Please remember that it is available for all airport Owners and Tenants (past and present), as well as Database members, and of course their friends and colleagues.

The cost for each place in the Enclosure is £20 and, if you need an order form please email me (john@bigginhillreunited.co.uk) with the numbers required and I will put you on the reservation list. Tickets will be offered in the order that reservations are received and once offered the place, the reservation will only be held for 48 hours to allow payment and the order form to reach us. (after that time, the tickets will be made available to others instead).

As in previous years, the enclosure will provide a marquee with tables and seating, plus a garden area with seating to view the display right on the front of the flight display line. There will be a pay bar in the marquee offering an assortment of beers, spirits and wines, plus teas and coffees. Guests will be free to bring their own picnics and refreshments to enjoy through the display.

NICK DAVIDSON MEMORIAL FLYING SCHOLLARSHIPS

Another two "Nick Davidson Memorial Flying Scholarships" are being funded by the Davidson family to enable two more young persons between the ages of 15 and 25 to learn to fly and qualify to the standard of a full Private Pilot's Licence (PPL) at Biggin Hill Airport. Individual scholarship will be offered for 2017 and 2018 following interviews for all applicants before a selection panel.

Promoted and managed in association with London Biggin Hill Airport, the scheme now benefits from support by Shipping & Airlines, Adams Aviation Supply Company and the Bamrah family. Flying training will be allocated to instructors at the Surrey and Kent Flying Club.

The initial two scholarships, which were a legacy from the late Captain Nick Davidson of British Airways who died from cancer in 2012, proved very successful with the winners, John Harrison and Steven Inch. John is now studying for his professional airline pilot's licence and Steven now under training to be a fighter pilot in the Royal Air Force.

MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

There has been much going on behind the scenes in May. Biggin Hill Airport were exhibitors at the EBACE trade show in Geneva and finalised various new deal that will be announced in the coming months. At home the weather was somewhat variable and traffic levels were largely as forecast.

Preparations for the Festival of Flight continue and the show promises to be entertaining. Tickets sales are much as expected so far, with the new "children go free" policy getting some positive feedback from the local community.

BHAL has now completed all negotiations with the Council on the revised airport operating hours and Council officers have submitted their report and recommendations to the Executive for consideration at their meeting on 15th June 2016 at 1900. We hope that this will be the last hurdle in the process. Once this milestone is passed, we will begin to install the Noise Monitoring and Track Keeping System and then apply the Noise Action Plan.

Once this is in place it will be impossible for those failing to abide by best practice to evade detection! We do not anticipate the new hours being adopted immediately because, of course, we have to increase staffing levels and train new staff before we can take advantage of the more flexible hours. However, the industry has responded favourably to the change of conditions at Biggin Hill and we expect to be making several announcements in the coming weeks regarding new investment at the aerodrome as a result of the changes.

The business world is currently holding its breath to see what will happen in the upcoming EU referendum. The Prime Minister appears to have forgotten his duty to the country and is doing his best, along with his misguided colleagues, to talk the UK into a recession. The economy has not responded as he expected and steadfastly refuses to take a downturn! The outcome is too close to call at present, but it is to be hoped that the result will be to leave the EU as the level of regulation and additional red tape that is foisted upon the airport annually cannot be borne any longer. Frankly, it makes no one any safer and serves only to add layer upon layer of unnecessary costs. It has reduced the UK CAA, once a worldwide gold standard in aviation regulation, to a tick box organisation with no thoughts or policies of its own.

On a personal level, I encourage everyone to vote to leave the EU for the sake of the next generation. Britain is an innovative, hard-working, nation that is different on every level to its European counterparts. We really do not need a fourth level of government, less still one that is not accountable to the electorate. The EU is a Marxist experiment that is not borne of democracy, but rather of a naked political ambition in the part of diehard EU federalists. It will not end well for the people of Europe. It took Britain over a thousand years to evolve the only known and proven method of government to truly make its people free and equal in the eyes of the law. It began with King Arthur deciding that a man accused of a crime should be tried by twelve of his peers - a jury - and not by the local baron. Magna Carta removed some powers from the crown and the English civil war finished the job by ensuring that no man, even the King, was above the law.
