BIGGIN HILL AIRPORT

An update about the building work discussed last month:

In the field east of the Bombardier hangar just over the road that takes users to the Falcon maintenance hangar and several other aircraft hangars, and of course to the Heritage Hangar, there is a very significant special maintenance and equipment supply facility that is there to cope with the eventual resurfacing of runway 21/03 soon, as I previously advised will be happening...

Bombardier's new aircraft spraying facility is now well under way to produce their new state-of-theart aircraft paint facility. That building is now clearly visible as a large hanger frame that they are constructing in between their own current hangar, and the old Fairflight hangar and the adjacent airport's "hub" building.

So, the airport's facilities are clearly expanding quite dramatically...

As described last month, the airport's advance planning for the new instrument approach on runway 03 will soon hopefully become formally available to attempt to remove the need for aircraft, including some of the quite large incoming jets, to come down the current 21 ILS and then do a relatively low circling manoeuvre round to 03.

This should hopefully eliminate any concerns that a lot of local residents have, especially those on the north side of the main runway, who are often worried about the noise of such relatively low flying aircraft circling for 03 after coming down the 21 ILS currently.

The airport is also planning to formally introduce a new Instrument Runway Visual Range (IRVR) system, and therefore also a 24-hour automated METAR reporting. That should be a tremendous improvement for us all.....

So, lots of significant improvements at Biggin Hill Airport are clearly now underway.....

Our Airport's CEO, David Winstanley, will include his regular monthly section, which is present towards the end of this newsletter, in order to keep us fully up to date with any airport plans that may affect us.....

MAY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, <u>excluding VAT and the Jet A1 price also excludes the</u> <u>Sustainable Aviation Fuel Levy</u>, for the calendar month of May 2025 are:

 \pm 1:66.00 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using <u>fuel account card Only</u> from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 5p per litre – and an additional 1p per litre off if also paid by Direct Debit)

£0:79.60 per litre for Jet A1

(As we explained regularly, the government had mandated that all JetA1 fuel to be sold with a 2% blend of Sustainable Aviation Fuel. This mandate, which is applicable to all UK airports, is intended to secure and grow UK SAF demand, support the growth of the SAF industry, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions of aviation fuels in the UK.

Due to the additional cost of introducing more expensive SAF into JetA1 fuel, as dictated by this compulsory government initiative, the airport has introduced the SAF levy on JetA1 sales since the beginning of this year. To aid clarity and transparency, they have included this to be displayed as a separate line on the invoices.)

<u>SPECIAL NOTES</u>: Users are advised that <u>credit and debit cards **can no longer** be used at the self-refuel pumps.</u> If you use self-refuelling, you will need your airport H-TEC fuel account card with you when you go there. (if you haven't got one with you, you will have to go over to the Main Terminal apron to uplift fuel from the bowsers instead).

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

April has turned out to be a very strong month for the Airport, with excellent weather towards the end of the month ensuring increased movements and a very strong start to the financial year. The Airport closed the previous financial year well ahead of budget despite overall movements being lower than forecast.

Anyone who has recently visited or flown from the Airport will notice the significant development underway across the Airport site. The steel frame for the new Bombardier state-of-the-art paint facility is well advanced and the scale of the build is clear to see. The runway resurfacing project is picking up pace with night works already underway in preparation for resurfacing to start by the end of May. The new Instrument Runway Visual Range (IRVR) system has now been in operation for over 2 months and we will be introducing 24-hour automated METAR reporting by the middle of May. This introduction was delayed due to one of the sensors being replaced and the data recalibrated. To keep fully up to date on these projects, please keep an eye on our social media channels: <u>Facebook</u>, <u>LinkedIn</u> and <u>Instagram</u>.

As previously mentioned, the Airport remains on track to achieve carbon neutral status by 2029 and we continue to build on the success of achieving our Carbon Reduction Level 2 Accreditation with the Airport Carbon Accreditation. Our newly formed Environmental Oversight Committee goes from strength to strength and the Airport is now looking at a concept to generate hydrogen on demand for potential heating solutions.

Post the CAA decision on 19th December 2024 to approve the IFP design packages V1.0, V1.1 and V1.2 of the London Biggin Hill RNP RWY 03 (Trial) and simulator validation plan, the focus over the first quarter of this calendar year has been to programme simulation and flight validation trails. The Airport is pleased to announce that the simulations were undertaken on the 14th and 15th of April and the results proved that there were no flyability issues identified and that the procedure worked well. The full trial is scheduled to commence in Q3 of this year.

The Airport remains pleased with the development and progress of the newly formed Private Pilots Group (PPG) and announced earlier this month that the PPG will replace the now disestablished Light Aviation Steering Group. This further demonstrates the Airport's continued commitment to the GA community. The Airport held a GA Pre-season Symposium at the Hub on Wednesday 9th April and, although the turnout was limited, the feedback was extremely positive.

The Airport is delighted with the continued success of the Airport Residents Noise Action Forum (ARNAF) in ensuring the Airport listens to the concerns of residents and, critically, brings together residents and the flying community. The work focused on the Keston NSA continues and I am grateful to the GA community for is support in this work.
