News from the CEO's Office

It seems hard to believe that 6 months have already passed since my first day in the post and, to be honest, with the very odd exception, I can say I have loved every minute. That's not to say my first 6 months hasn't been without its challenges; however, the potential in London Biggin Hill is there for all to see.

The Business Aviation Market remains a very challenging environment, although London Biggin Hill continues to buck the trend and hold its own. As I reported last month, the closure of RAF Northolt has not generated the traffic increase the Airport was expecting and the concerns regarding Brexit remain. That said, the Airport continues to invest in our infrastructure and welcome new operators.

I had hoped to have held the first meeting of the Light Aviation Steering Group in August; however, it looks like it will now be held towards the end of September and I will confirm the exact date towards the end of this week. I am delighted by the interest shown in being part of shaping light aviation at London Biggin Hill and I remain convinced the steering group will have a genuine impact and that the debates will be informative and lively!

Turning to development news, I am pleased to inform the Airport community that the work to resurface Taxiway Hotel proceeds at pace and the project is ahead of schedule. Again, I would like to thank all our partners for their cooperation and patience whilst we improve our Airport infrastructure. Work continues to deliver the GPS approach for Runway 03 and we now await final confirmation from Gatwick that they are content with our proposal prior to final submission to the CAA. This process has been delayed due to the holiday period.

The Airport continues to work with London South East Colleges to progress the development of the Aerospace Technology college. The current programme still targets an opening date in time for the 2020 academic year. Development work continues regarding the Airport's proposed Hotel development and additional hangar accommodation on site.

Finally, I would like to thank our partners for their support and cooperation during the Festival of Flight. I hope that those of you who joined us for the festival had a superb day.
