

Dear Biggin Hill Airport User

On behalf of Joe Merchant and Bill Robinson, and all those involved in organising the recent Biggin Hill 60's and 70's reunion, I would like to thank all those who attended the event. I do hope that you had as good a day as we did on this very special occasion. For those who were unable to make it, I am sorry that we did not have the opportunity of meeting you again. It was truly amazing to see so many of the friends from those incredibly sociable days in the past, and worth all the effort that was put in to organise the event.

For Joe and I, having committed ourselves to several thousands of pounds up front to hire the marquee, furnishings, stage, and dance-floor etc., it was really gratifying to find that you all donated so generously to the fund. In the end, not only did we cover all our costs, but we also generated a substantial sum for charity. The exact amount of the surplus will be determined over the next few weeks but, at the time of writing this letter, the total from all sources, including the profits from the barbecue, would appear to amount to around £1500. Thank you all very much. (Please accept my apologies for not acknowledging all donations personally)

Thank you also to everyone who has phoned, written, faxed, or emailed, us showing appreciation for organising the reunion - such letters are much appreciated.

I have seen the video, and can confirm that it is an absolutely perfect reminder of that special day and, at £20 (delivered), it represents excellent value.

The following is the text of the mailer being sent out by PIC Productions who produced the video of the Reunion.....

"We have now completed work on the commemorative video of "The Bump Reunion" and John Willis (who organised the event with Joe Merchant and Bill Robinson) has suggested that we contact you in case you might like to purchase a copy as a memento of that unique occasion.

It runs for around 45 minutes and has been carefully edited to include pictures of the great majority of people who attended. As well as depicting as many people as possible we have tried to convey a flavour of the activities that took place from start to finish without it becoming a boring presentation. Chris Smith (leader of "The String of Pearls Orchestra") kindly gave permission for us to record the superb sounds of his big band and these add greatly to the nostalgic appeal of the production. Frank Gosling's attempt to conduct the band playing "The Magnificent Men in their Flying Machines" is something that definitely ought not to be missed!

I and my colleagues have had a long association with the airfield and, like yourself, were guests at the event. We have produced the video as a purely speculative project and are not seeking to profit from it. Once costs have been covered any "extra over" will be donated to the fund's charity.
